B. "You're traveling in another country; a police officer pulls you over, and explains that there will be no citation, but there is a \$5 "convenience" charge. What do you risk by giving in?"

A. "What response offers the best possible outcome here? What are the risks of that response?"

B. "What is the most violent way to resolve this situation? What new risks would that create?"
